an end to the restructuring, as well as the safeguarding of sites and know-how, which are much needed in Europe

that Caterpillar commit to a long-term industrial strategy which ensures the future of its activities throughout Europe

a genuine social dialogue with Caterpillar's decision-makers, which respects national and European laws on information and consultation for the entire restructuring process

the discussion and consideration of alternative proposals for sustainable and socially responsible economic development
